- Primary concern is that it weakens state jurisdiction
- 29 states have entered compact, many are finding that there is not a lot of benefit and are actively trying to get out of the compact. ONA will not change position and is opposed to giving away authority in the state of Oregon.

#### Larlene Dunsmuir: 11.

- ONA hosts nurse leadership institute, opportunity to develop leadership skills and is free to members
- 9-month program, meets once a month
- Launching recruitment at ONA convention next week, applications open through first week of August
